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## CREATE RELATIONSHIPS.

Build a rapport and tap into students' interests. A personal connection makes communication easier and can help motivate students.

**FlexPointer:** Notice your student didn't turn in an assignment when it was due? Send them a text to check in.

## DIVE INTO THE DATA.

Many online learning management systems make it easy as 3.14 ( $\pi$ ) to see when students have logged into a course and for how long—don't be afraid to reference that data!

**FlexPointer:** Even without automated data tracking you can keep track of patterns, like:

- Frequency of responses to text/emails
- Live lesson attendance
- Frequency of assignment submissions

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## ASK THEM HOW IT'S GOING.

No matter their age, if you take the time to engage, most students will typically tell you how they're doing.

**FlexPointer:** Try open-ended questions to get the conversation going. Like, what was your favorite part of the course this week?

## TRY PERSONALIZED FEEDBACK.

Taking the time to provide personalized feedback on a student's assignment is a small task with a big impact.

**FlexPointer:** Try voice memos or audio messages to add another layer of personalization.

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## MEET WITH THEM ONE-ON-ONE.

From working sessions to discussion-based assessments, nothing beats individualized learning time with students.
